Dear Parents and carers,

As winter draws in, dark mornings linger and even darker afternoons encroach, we are always reminded of the need to 'wear it bright' in order to be as safe as possible when we use pavements and roads on our journeys to and from school. Many of you will be aware from my weekly blog that in addition to visibility, the need for wearing a cycle helmet was brought into sharp focus for the St Peter's community when one such item saved the life of a Year 6 pupil at the start of November. Now that the shock of the event has been digested and the pupil is making a good recovery at Southampton General, I am able to reflect on two requests I would like to make. Firstly, if your child or grandchild does not have a safety helmet to wear when cycling or scooting, it can make a great addition to any Christmas list. There are now so many exciting and enticing designs of helmet on the market that everyone can find one they like. Secondly, I ask with heartfelt resolution for anyone riding a bike or a scooter onto St Peter's site, *be that pupil, sibling, parent or carer*, to please wear a safety helmet for that journey. We can set a wonderful example as a school in the local area to be recognised as a community that really does take the safety of all road users seriously.

When we reach our second 6C day on Friday 9th December, a day of mixed year and cross-curricular learning, we will also be doing some fundraising for the Hampshire Air Ambulance, a service which provided invaluable assistance on the day of the accident. I know that the St Peter's community is always generous in its giving, and many requests are made throughout the year, but any financial support for this enterprise would be greatly appreciated. More news on this will follow in due course.

And so to Advent. I am something of a stickler for distinguishing between Advent and Christmas. In school during December, the children will be focusing on the preparation and anticipation that Advent in itself entails, and not just seeing it as a day by day, chocolate by chocolate, countdown to Christmas. One of the many joys of working in a faith school is the opportunity for us to reflect openly on the joy that our Christian festivals bring us, but we should not let the commercial build up to Christmas overwhelm the importance of making proper readiness for celebrating the birth of Christ. Christmas comes but once a year, and come it will on 25th December, but for now, let us help our children to prepare properly by making a meaningful and spiritual use of the time given to us in Advent.
